Dr. Jim Ellsworth led for 3 decades in the military learning enterprise, retiring at the 1-star/SES level. He developed the initial strategy for performance-based credentialing of GEOINT professionals, designed & directed the Naval War College online programs, created the evaluation system for Army Intelligence training, led writing of the GS-17xx Master Career Development Plan for CP 35 (Intelligence) & advised the Army's General Officer leadership in crafting its Learning Model & Strategy.
